Goals

Educate employees about Hispanic and Latino history, culture, and contributions.

Create an inclusive and celebratory environment. Encourage participation, conversation, and cultural appreciation.

Step 1

Step 2

Create a 4-Week Engagement Calendar

WEEK 1

Launch & Awareness

- Send a company-wide email to all employees announcing the start of Hispanic Heritage Month. This message should include a brief explanation of what Hispanic Heritage Month is, why it matters, and how your organization plans to participate by recognizing the contributions of Latino and Hispanic communities in the United States.
- Display printable posters around the office and/or post them on internal communication platforms to promote awareness and engagement. Refer to the website resource center of CincinnatiHispanicHeritage.com.
- Share a daily "Did You Know?" fact related to Hispanic culture, history, or notable figures through email, Slack, or digital monitors.

WEEK 2

Education & Conversation

- Host a Lunch & Learn: Cater a Latino Restaurant, and have them explain the Latino Cuisine
- Share spotlights on famous Latino and local figures in U.S. history.
 (Using the 2025 HHM Presentation + video)
- Use toolkit or videos from HispanicStar.org.

WEEK 3

Celebration & Culture

- Organize a Latino Cuisine Day—this can take the form of a potluck, a food truck visit, or a catered lunch featuring dishes from various Latin American cultures.
- Play Latin music in shared spaces to create an uplifting and culturally rich atmosphere. (Include a link to a curated playlist.)
- Encourage staff to wear traditional attire or bring items that represent their cultural heritage to share with colleagues.
- Invite a Latino Folkloric Dance group or a mariachi band to perform. (For recommendations, refer to the Resources section on www.HCCUSA.US.)

WEEK 4

Engagement & Impact

- Spotlight Latino/a/x employees in newsletters or on social media by sharing their stories and achievements.
- Organize a service project or donation drive supporting a local Latino-led nonprofit.
- Host a closing roundtable to reflect on key takeaways and discuss ongoing support.
